ARRANGEMENT OF SECTIONS

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AN ACT TO RATIFY THE ASSUMPTION OF ADMINISTRATION AND FINANCIAL CONTROL OF MOENG COLLEGE BY THE MINISTRY OF EDUCATION AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE STATUS OF THE COLLEGE AND THE DEVOLUTION OF ITS ASSETS AND LIABILITIES.

Date of Assent: 27.7.1971.

Date of Commencement: 6.8.1971.

ENACTED by the Parliament of Botswana.

1. This Act may be cited as the Moeng College Act, 1971. Short title
2. In this Act —
“Moeng College” means the educational institution established by the Moeng College Constitution Proclamation (Chapter 80).
Interpretation
3. The assumption by the Ministry of Education of the administration and financial control of Moeng College on the 14th May, 1971, is ratified and confirmed.
Assumption of administration and financial control of Moeng College ratified and confirmed

Moeng College deemed to be a Government school

Devolution of assets and liabilities of Moeng College

Ownership of land on which Moeng College is situated

4. Moeng College is deemed as from the 14th May, 1971, inclusive to have been a Government school maintained out of public funds and managed by the Ministry of Education under the provisions of the Education Law, 1966.

5. (1) The assets and liabilities of Moeng College existing at midnight on the 13th May, 1971, are deemed as from the 14th May, 1971, inclusive to have vested in the Government.

(2) The assets referred to in subsection (1) shall be applied to the purposes of Moeng College as an educational institution.

6. It is recorded that the ownership of the land heretofore assigned for the use of Moeng College and on which Moeng College is situated is in process of being granted to the State by the Ngwato Land Board under the provisions of the Tribal Land Act, 1968.
